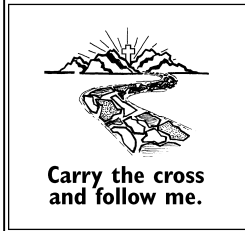

Bishop Mitchell T. Rozanski will celebrate a special liturgy on **Sunday, Sept. 11 at 10am at St. Michael's Cathedral,** Springfield to commemorate the 15th anniversary of the attacks of September 11, 2001.

This Mass will be broadcast live as part of the "Chalice of Salvation" program on WWLP 22News. The public is cordially invited to attend in person or via this telecast.
