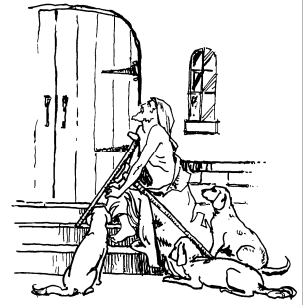

ARE YOU A PRACTICING CATHOLIC?
