

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading: The glory of the Lord shines on all people.

(Isaiah 60: 1-6)

Psalm: "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you."

(Psalm 72)

Second Reading: God's secret plan is revealed. (*Ephesians*

Gospel: They presented gifts of gold, frankincense, and

myrrh. (Matthew 2:1-12)

THE GIFTS OF THE THREE WISE MEN

Since the early days of Christianity, Biblical scholars and theologians have offered varying interpretations of the meaning and significance of the gold, frankincense and myrrh that were presented to Jesus, according to the Gospel of Matthew (2:11). These valuable items were standard gifts to honor a king or deity in the ancient world: gold as a precious metal, frankincense as perfume or incense, and myrrh as anointing oil. In fact, these same three items were apparently among the gifts, recorded in ancient inscriptions, that King Seleucus II Callinicus offered to the god Apollo at the temple in Miletus in 243 B.C.E. The Book of Isaiah, when describing Jerusalem's glorious restoration, tells of nations and kings who will come and "bring gold and frankincense and shall proclaim the praise of the Lord" (Isaiah 60:6). Although Matthew's gospel does not include the names or number of the magi, many believe that the number of the gifts is what led to the tradition of the Three Wise Men.

BLESSING WITH CHALK AND INCENSE

Placed by the manger in our church these symbols are used in a traditional method for blessing homes. The chalk is used to mark 20+C+M+B+17 over the doorway. The numerals consecrate the new year. The initials remind us of the Magi: Caspar, Melchior & Balthasar and also stand for the Latin motto "Christus mansionem benedicat ("May Christ bless this house!") The Polish use a K for Kaspar. While using the chalk to write the above inscription it is customary to say a prayer and burn the incense.

Head of Household: "Peace be to this house and to all who dwell here, in the name of the Lord.

All: Blessed be God forever.

May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness and the keeping of your law. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our love for each other may go out to all. RESPECT FOR THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

Respect for the Blessed Sacrament in Catholic churches is shown by genuflecting (kneeling) upon entering and leaving the church and when passing in front of the tabernacle. Please advise your children & grandchildren about these customs and the reason for them. If because of physical limitations you cannot kneel, a respectful bow is permitted. Also, chewing gum, food and/or drinks should not be brought into the church.

PLEASE DON'T PASS ON YOUR COLD!

We share a lot of things as part of a Catholic parish family, but one thing we don't want to pass on is a cold. Eucharistic Ministers are taught to wipe the chalice with a clean part of the purificator. Still, if you have a cold or do not feel well, please refrain from receiving from the chalice. It is not required to partake of both species (bread & wine), either contains the fullness of Jesus' presence. If you are not receiving from the chalice it is customary to make a bow when you pass by as a sign of respect. Also, during winter months, some people choose to make the sign of peace through a wave or a bow rather than shaking hands. It is sometimes awkward to adjust but a courteous wave back is a friendly response.
