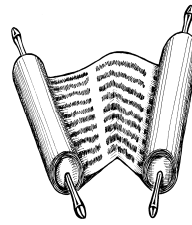

LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. **Good Friday** is a day of **abstinence** from meat & also a day of **fast**, that is only *one full meal* is allowed. Two other meatless meals sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to one's needs, but together they may not equal another full meal.

2. The other **Fridays** of Lent are days of **abstinence** from meat.

3. The obligation to **abstain** from meat commences at fourteen (14) years of age.

4. The obligation to **fast** commences at eighteen (18) and ends at fifty-nine (59) years of age.

Although the faithful enjoy *freedom of conscience* to excuse themselves for a just cause from these laws of *fast and abstinence*, the obligation to do penance is a serious one and they should substitute another form of penance. No Catholic should lightly excuse himself/herself from this obligation in the Lenten season.

In light of the fact that this year St. Patrick's Day falls on a Friday, Bishop Rozanski has decided to issue a dispensation from the Lenten practice of abstaining from eating meat for that Friday only to those Catholics wishing to mark this day honoring the patron saint of Ireland.

Those wishing to avail themselves of this dispensation should seriously consider a substitute Lenten practice of sacrifice or charity.

RICE BOWL KITS are available at the entrances to use as a way of sharing with the poor and hungry during Lent. Some families eat simpler meals and put the savings in. Others donate each time they eat between meals. How can you share?
